Dear friends

*Another summer (!) has come to an end. Very soon the trees will be denuded of leaves and the evenings will get darker. I do hope that you had a chance to break from the usual routine; whether that was to get away from it all, or just take it a little easier than normal. Just as God has set the world up such that the seasons change, ebbing and flowing throughout the year, it is a creational principle that, as we work, so we must rest and recharge our batteries. One Christian writer (Pastor Rick Warren of Saddleback Community Church) has put it this way – **“Divert daily – Withdraw weekly – Abandon annually!”***

In other words, there ought to be a rhythm to our lives, at work and play. Our leisure time is an important pause in the demanding daily pursuits God calls us to engage with. Jesus knew and understood this; indeed, He modelled that very thing in His own life and ministry. On more than one occasion in the Gospel story, we find Him seeking out isolated places to rest and pray. In some people's estimation that is shirking your responsibilities. But, I don't think anyone could accuse Christ of such a thing. He served others on a regular basis; teaching, healing, and providing for their physical and spiritual needs. In fact, it might be argued that He was more effective in His ministry because He did take time out.

The church session that lies ahead in the latter part of 2011 and early months of 2012 promise to be a busy time for us in Dalziel St. Andrew's. Our Makeover Project is progressing really well and the Pilot Befriender Project, which will serve isolated elderly people in our wider community, is also starting to get up a head of steam. And, this is all in addition to the many other activities and events we get involved with through organisations on a regular basis. Such things are important; since it is through these that we show faithfulness to God's call to build His Kingdom. However, let us ensure we get the balance between activity, worship and prayer just right. May we never delude ourselves into thinking that we can achieve anything of lasting value without leaning on the Lord.

Makeover Project – Forward for Jesus

Halls: The contract for the installation of our new boilers has been proceeding throughout the summer. All was going well until near the end when a couple of problems emerged with the flue liner and inadequate gas pressure. Our Consultant, Mr MacOwan, has been working hard with the contractor, Gibson Wight of Kilmarnock, to ensure that all work is completed satisfactorily and we have the heating secure for the colder months ahead.

Although not in our contract work the large upper hall looks great now thanks to a fresh coat of paint put on by our Task Group who work so hard each Wednesday morning.

Sanctuary: Our Consultant Architect, Mr George Waterston, has been busy with his team over the last few months working up the detail of the makeover of the sanctuary including the so important chancel extension; quiet room; toilet at the front door; lighting and heating design. Next

phase will see application being made for relevant statutory consents. Mr Waterston has been in touch with officials at North Lanarkshire Council who are supportive of our efforts.

The **Seat Appeal** was launched in early summer and over £7000 has now been contributed towards the cost of our new seats for sanctuary and chancel. Many thanks indeed to all who have contributed. We anticipate that our seats will cost around £100 and we need over 400 in total. This contribution is so welcome. If you have not done so yet and would like to contribute towards our appeal the Treasurer will be delighted to accept any donations.

Organ: A separate article on the Organ is included within the magazine.

Thanks: The Congregational Board has emphasised the importance of passing on their thanks to the many people who are working hard in raising funds for the Makeover Project. We cannot single anyone out as so many are working and giving to secure success. **Thank you all so much.**

Our Walcker Pipe Organ

Just about there! After more than a year of hard work and fund raising we are now in a position to commence the Phase 1 of Organ Restoration. We are assured that this work will result in the organ returning to full use. A later Phase

involving the remaining part will need to await more funds being secured.

We have previously reported the very generous contributions of £30,000 from the Environmental Key Fund and £50,000 from the Heritage Lottery Fund. In addition our own donations and fund raising has continued throughout the year. With the cost estimate for this phase at around £110,000 we were keen to secure one other grant to take us closer to the target before proceeding. In July we were delighted when the London based Pilgrim Trust accepted our case for support for this very special instrument and have awarded a grant of £15,000. We are now sufficiently close to our target to allow us to proceed and we have entered into a contract with Walcker & Son of Germany, one of the three companies who tendered for the work. Guided by Mr James MacKenzie, an expert organ consultant from Glasgow, we now await the removal of the console and inner workings of part of the organ. These will be shipped to Germany to be worked on during the winter months. Walcker and Son is the same company who manufactured the organ all those years ago with Gerhard Walcker having visited us twice as part of the tendering process. The firm are delighted to have been awarded this contract for the restoration of “their” organ. Apparently there are now no more than 10/20 such organs in original condition operational in Europe.

We are advised (by both Mr MacKenzie and Herr Walcker) that it would be unwise to re-install and tune the organ other than in better weather months and so the plan is for the organ to be brought back next May/June. It will then take about 4 months to complete the installation and fine tuning.

Payments for the work will be made throughout the year at various stages. We are very grateful to all who continue to contribute to the funds we need to complete this so important work. Jeanette Boyd is planning a Country Dance Evening and another Ceilidh for October and January. The first Ceilidh raised over £800! Thank you so much for your patience, support, encouragement and donations.

What is your favourite hymn played on the organ? We will need to have a celebration service when it is working again. Suggestions please. Any memories of special services/occasions when the organ made a difference to your worship experience? It would be good to hear from you. The Heritage Lottery Fund, who are so very interested in our project, has asked if there are any “stories” associated with the use of the organ which we may care to publicise.

Fire Safety

As part of our makeover project – Forward for Jesus, we carried out a fire risk assessment survey on 3rd November 2010. Since then we have gradually been working through a programme of work as set out by our assessor Mr John Martin MBE MIFireE of Curfue Ltd. New signage has appeared above exit doors, some doorstoppers and extrusions have been removed and walls with electric cables passing through have been effectively sealed, all of this work having been carried out by our own property task force.

On 31st March 2011 a fire Instruction/training course was organised and aimed at all organisations within the Church, the course was presented by Douglas Smith, a member within our own congregation who is very much involved with similar activities during his daily work at Honeywell Controls. Douglas gave an excellent power point presentation at which 23 people representing almost all of our organisations attended. This showed tremendous support and encouragement. There will be a follow up course organised in the near future to which everyone will be welcome to attend.

Other issues remain, such as a new fire alarm system, new fire exit doors and final exit door ramps, all of which are being considered by our appointed architect and will be included in the makeover - Forward for Jesus Project.

It is vital that all of us recognise that the safety of our congregation is of great importance. We acknowledge that we are classed as a low risk, but it is extremely important that we never ever become complacent.

Bibles for Africa

Many thanks to those who have handed in bibles as part of our Bibles for Africa Appeal. These have all made their way through Advent Hope Ministries to Africa where there is such a hunger for God's Word.

In Africa there is a great shortage of Bibles with a huge demand for even parts of the Word. Advent Hope Ministries

has a scheme for sending unused Bibles to that part of the world with container shipments regularly sent from the United Kingdom for free distribution to those thirsting for the Word of God. In many cases the local people could not afford to buy a Bible even if one was available.

We have a local contact in Motherwell (Mr Ken Hatcher) who devotes a large part of his time to gathering and packing off bibles to a central collection point in England.

Do you have any unused Bibles? Any edition. Would you be able to help in getting these to others who are so eager to read the Good News? If you have any, and would like to help, Alex Baird will gladly take these on to Ken for forwarding with the others he receives and so help in a small way to bring the wonderful words and guidance of the Bible to those who at the present time have no Bible of their own. Social Committee

The Social Committee has been busy over the summer months. They have organised a Nearly New/Bric-a-Brac Sale as well as a Strawberry Tea. In July Colin Weir and the B.B. Officers held the American Brunch. These events resulted in around £790 being raised for the makeover project. The next event will take place before the Newsletter is delivered and will be a Country Lunch after morning service on Sunday 21st August.

The Makeover table on a Sunday has now raised the sum of £3440 since it started last June. Thanks must go to everyone involved in these events.

The annual afternoon tea for the senior members of the congregation will take place on Saturday 3rd September.

The Committee are now working on other events. The ones organised so far will be a Christmas Fayre on Saturday 3rd December and the Annual Christmas Tea on Sunday 18th December after the morning service.

Our large Hall was hired out on Saturday 13th August for a birthday party for 2 youngsters from our Sunday school. If anyone would be interested in using the Hall for a similar event, please feel free to discuss the matter with me.

Befriender Project

Concern for the isolation felt by so many elderly people in the town lies behind the Befriender Pilot Project, which we will start in January 2012. The pilot will run for a year to allow time to assess whether we can make this a permanent part of our outreach work for the Lord from Dalziel St. Andrew's. Derek has highlighted the many members and others he comes across whom we know would benefit from regular visits from volunteer befrienders.

Thanks to the Thomson Legacy (which is focussed directly on elderly people living alone) we have been able, with full support from the Kirk Session and Congregational Board, to put together a case for financial support from other organisations to allow us to set up the pilot. Our intention is to recruit a part-time Co-ordinator in the autumn that will

work with us in preparing the pilot and guide us throughout its first year initially. We hope to secure up to 15 “Matches” of volunteers and elderly clients with the prospect of weekly visits designed to address, in some measure, the isolation experienced.

We have secured most helpful advice from the local Social Work Department who are very supportive of our efforts. We have also been able to talk to UTHEO, based at Orbiston Parish Church in Bellshill, who have been carrying out a successful scheme, Be Friend Bellshill, for over three years now.

Our estimated cost of running the pilot is around £20,000 with the Congregational Board agreeing to contribute £5,000 from the Thomson Bequest as our congregational contribution to the Pilot Scheme. Approaches have been made to several other agencies to attempt to secure the match funding we need and we are indebted to Social Work Department of North Lanarkshire Council; the Parish Development Fund of the Church of Scotland; and Faiths in Scotland Community Action Fund (FiSCAF) who have all kindly agreed to support our project. As a result, we now have the funds identified to allow us to plan to implement the pilot in the New Year.

We had a most encouraging response to a meeting of those in our congregation who would like to help with our project. Others have volunteered since the meeting. Thank you all so much. We will now take this forward and look to recruit those we need to make it work in the autumn/winter. We will be in touch and keep all advised through the weekly notices

sheet. However, if you would like to know more about the scheme or care to assist in any way (administration, financial expertise required as well as volunteer befrienders) please do speak to any of the group who have developed this project.
