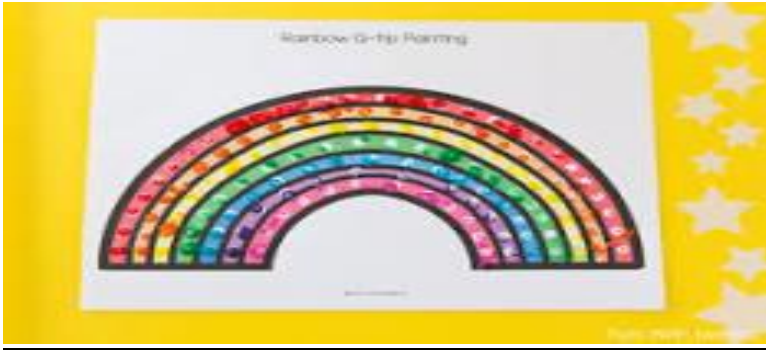


# Cotton bud rainbow



## What to do

- Find your blank rainbow in your pack.
- Dip your cotton buds into the paint. Now dab paint onto your rainbow until it looks bright and colourful.

## Think about

- During this activity you could think about a rainbow being a symbol of God's promise never to flood the Earth again.
- The next time you see a rainbow remember that God always keeps his promises.

# Dove Game



## What to do

- Find your olive branches inside your craft pack.
- Ask an adult to hide them for you inside or outdoors. Can you find them all? How long did it take? Maybe you could hide them again and try to beat your time?

## Think about

- During this activity you could think about the dove showing that the flood was over.
- The dove has become a symbol of peace. Perhaps you could pray for peace in difficult situations throughout our world or pray for help for anything worrying you in your own life.

# God's Promises



## What to do

- Find your God's Promises template.
- Decorate the cloud by sticking cotton wool onto it.
- Now cut the promises into strips and stick them onto the bottom of your cloud.

## Think about



- During this activity you could think about the rainbow in the Noah's ark story being a symbol of God's promises.
- Read the promises on the colourful strips (or ask an adult to help you).
- If you want to find out more you could look up these verses in the bible (online versions of the bible are available too).

# Pavement chalk rainbow



## What to do

- Use your pavement chalk to make a giant outdoor rainbow or colourful picture.

## Think about

- During this activity you could think about the importance of the rainbow in the Noah's ark story.
- What might happen when it rains? Your beautiful picture will be washed away just as the flood washed all the things in Noah's world away.

# Junk Model Ark



## What to do

- Collect some junk materials from your home. It could be boxes, cartons etc.
- Can you use them to make an ark? Is it able to float?

## Think about

- During this activity you could think about how Noah trusted God and followed his instructions. He built the ark just as God told him and God kept Noah and his family safe.
- Can we be more like Noah and trust God too?
- Perhaps you could say a prayer to ask God to look after you as you sail through the journey of life.

# Animal pairs



## What to do

- Find the pairs templates in your pack. You can cut out the ready made pairs game OR colour in the blank animals and cut them out OR draw your own animals and cut them out (remember you need 2 of each animal).
- You could ask another family member to hide one of each animal. Can you pair the animals back up by finding them all?
- You could play a game of animal pairs with someone in your home. Turn the cards face down. If you turn over two the same you can keep them. Who manages to get the most pairs?

## Think about

- During this activity you could think about two of each animal being taken onto the ark with Noah and his family.



# Skittles Rainbow



## What to do

- Collect your packet of skittles from your bag.
- Place the skittles round the edge of a white plate in a circle shape.
- Pour warm water onto the centre of the plate until it reaches the skittles
- WOW – what do you notice?

## Think about

- During this activity you could think about the importance of the rainbow in the Noah story. It is a reminder that God keeps his promises.

# Animal Masks



## What to do

- Find your mask template in your pack. Colour it in and cut it out. Hold it up to make a mask. You could also attach it to a lollipop stick, straw or pipe-cleaner.
- If you would prefer to create your own mask we would love to see that too!

## Think about

- During this activity you could think about the animals going onto the ark along with Noah and his family.
- Perhaps you could use this along with some of the other resources in your pack to re-tell the amazing story of Noah's journey.
